# SPECIAL OPPORTUNITY FOR LEARNING OR SHARPENING YOUR SKILLS TO BE A LEADER IN YOUR LOCAL CHURCH SETTING

Are you being asked (or called) to consider assuming a leadership position in your church, one for which you may never have dreamed or asked, or one that is calling to you from within your spirit? Perhaps you are being asked to help lead worship, but you don't feel comfortable reading the Bible out loud. All the names and places that are hard to pronounce always come when you are leading, don't they?! Or after years of avoiding saying "yes" the time has now come when you feel you need to respond affirmatively for leading a work area or even the council/board of the church.

Is your church looking for new ways to do great ministry with fewer people, fewer dollars, and you are feeling the need to lead, speak and care for others in your church when you least feel prepared to be that leader? It certainly is possible to learn how to step into these roles with confidence, humility, and grace. Maybe you or someone you know needs a tad of training and a boat load of encouragement. Here's that opportunity.

The Lay Servant Ministries of the United Methodist Church, through the Discipleship Resources has produced a set of study books and we have the opportunity to form groups that can study together in person or through phone or computer (on-line) accessible opportunities. The time seems right to begin to explore together how we can continue to Be the Church right where we are, even in the middle of all the change in the world, our homes, families and communities. The first class is an overview of the types of Lay Servant Ministries trainings available: learning to Lead, to Care, and to Speak. There is a very good beginning to this class that helps us understand how our Methodist history, our doctrines and essential elements of faith come together to help lead us as we learn to become better disciples, people who help others become disciples, for the transformation of the world.

The sessions can be planned around the number of people who want to explore together, and around the distance between one another. There would probably be a 1-2 hour introduction (online or via cell phone), then a 2 week time of study on your own or in small groups locally, followed by a group meeting in person, with one last 1-2 hour (online or via cell phone). About 7 hours of group time, 5-10 hours of self-study, reading and reflection, total. Yes, there would be driving to at least one meeting that might be in another town, but fellowship, fun and food make all things better, right? Everything else can be done on your time.
