The above schedule demonstrates that KFUMC is in a deficit situation regarding the full-year budget and Year-to-Date Income/Expenses. The adjusted budget shows a deficit that would have to be financed out of reserves, and hopefully that will not be necessary. Staff and Team Leaders have been requested to keep expenditures to a minimum during this time. However, we are hoping that members will recognize the need to continue our programs and help avoid a deficit. Normally the summer months show lower incomes because many members are on vacation. Please remember that the church continues to have expenses and provides programs through the summer.
