Thank you to the church staff who introduces me to people, and who care for you in their ministries until I can come alongside them to be part of the good work they do. But I get impatient that I seem to know so few after a whole month. I remind myself that patience and perseverance are both virtues the scriptures address multiple times! They are fruits of the Spirit, lauded behaviors that produce results,

commended by Jesus in several stories. Surely, I can accomplish this!

How wonderful it has been to go to meetings and work groups, and small groups, craft groups, and potlucks! How marvelous it has been to meet some of you in your homes or at a coffee shop. What joy to speak with some of you for more than a few moments at a time. This is how I experience grace and peace from God and Christ Jesus.

# The Tie That Binds

Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. — Colossians 3: 14-15

Relationships form us. One of the most treasured hymns of Christianity in the last century was "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." As we gather for worship in this series, we will be invited to consider how our relationship with the Holy and with each other form and transform us. And we will affirm the power of God's presence in our worshiping community to inspire us to "go and do likewise" in relationship to the world.

#### **Galatians 5:16-18, 22-23, 25-26 (The Message)**

My counsel is this: Live freely, animated and motivated by God's Spirit. Then you won't feed the compulsions of selfishness. For there is a root of sinful self-interest in us that is at odds with a free spirit, just as the free spirit is incompatible with selfishness. These two ways of life are contrary to each other, so that you cannot live at times one way and at times another way according to how you feel on any given day. Why don't you choose to be led by the Spirit and so escape the erratic compulsions of a law-dominated existence?

22-23 But what happens when we live God's way? He brings gifts into our lives, much the same way that fruit appears in an orchard—things like affection for others, exuberance about life,

serenity. [But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness,

goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.] We develop a willingness to stick with things, a sense of compassion in the heart, and a conviction that a basic holiness permeates things and people. We find ourselves involved in loyal commitments, not needing to force our way in life, able to marshal and direct our energies wisely.

<sup>25-26</sup> Since this is the kind of life we have chosen, the life of the Spirit, let us make sure that we do not just hold it as an idea in our heads or a sentiment in our hearts, but work out its implications in every detail of our lives. That means we will not compare ourselves with each other as if one of us were better and another worse. We have far more interesting things to do with our lives. Each of us is an original.

### **Impersonation Attempts**

This week, we've seen an increase in sophisticated impersonation and social engineering attempts. Be prepared to defend against these bad actors by staying informed and vigilant.

#### Overview

- Attack Methods: Emails, phone calls, and text messages are being used to attempt access to online accounts and sensitive information.
  - Deceptive Techniques: Bad actors use Caller ID spoofing and voice generation to create a false sense of safety and familiarity.

#### **Key Points**

 No Personal Info Requests: We will never contact you by phone, email, or text to ask for personal information like your account number, verification codes, or online banking username.

#### **Security Reminders**

- Email Security
- Verify the sender's email address by hovering over the name.
  - Avoid opening suspicious links or attachments.
  - Be wary of emails creating urgency or using scare tactics.
    - Phone Call Security
    - Do not trust caller ID; it can be spoofed.
- If asked for sensitive information or if something doesn't seem quite right, hang up and call the trusted number for your banker or branch.
  - Text Message Security
  - Your bank will NEVER ask for personal information via text.
    - Do not click links from unknown senders.
- Verify the sender before taking any action and delete suspicious messages.
