But it seems I have a habit of doing this: skipping ahead to something exciting and backtracking to pick up something I forgot. I have been blessed by the people who simply roll their eyes and then go with the flow.

One could say I'm not paying attention to what I am doing. Or, one could say I am paying attention to what the Spirit is doing through me. Since the second option sounds better, I chose it: I was being guided by the Spirit.

As we passed our offering plates, and as the children waited for us to get back to the skipped time with Young Disciples, I thought about being a child and the joy I had when attending church with Granny. She always had a quarter for me to put in the offering plate. Then I thought about how our children at KFUMC leave worship *before* the offering. They were missing out! On their behalf I felt cheated.

Over the next couple of days, I checked in with Leadership Team members and with staff members, and together we decided to adopt this Spirit-directed change. It turns out the children do have the opportunity to make an offering when they go to Children's Church at 9:00 during the school year. And, they have learned the traditional Doxology so they can sing with the adults when they are in Adult Church. It seems like we should give them the opportunity to use what they learn, to sing their thanksgiving and praise to God. As we read in Psalm 133, *How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity!* Worshipping together is a great uniting thing to do.

When the offering plate comes our way, let us let us receive it and pass it on with reverence. Let us place our prayer cards in with confidence that the power of prayer by our church family is real. Let us place our offering in it with joyful generosity for God, who will do much with what we give. If you've already sent your gift by another route, remember the satisfaction of taking care of this important, loving task. And in all ways, let the children see the importance of doing this activity of church together.

Impersonation Attempts

This week, we've seen an increase in sophisticated impersonation and social engineering attempts. Be prepared to defend against these bad actors by staying informed and vigilant.

Overview

- Attack Methods: Emails, phone calls, and text messages are being used to attempt access to online accounts and sensitive information.
 - Deceptive Techniques: Bad actors use Caller ID spoofing and voice generation to create a false sense of safety and familiarity.

Key Points

 No Personal Info Requests: We will never contact you by phone, email, or text to ask for personal information like your account number, verification codes, or online banking username.

Security Reminders

- Email Security
- Verify the sender's email address by hovering over the name.
 - Avoid opening suspicious links or attachments.
 - Be wary of emails creating urgency or using scare tactics.
 - Phone Call Security
 - Do not trust caller ID; it can be spoofed.
- If asked for sensitive information or if something doesn't seem quite right, hang up and call the trusted number for your banker or branch.
 - Text Message Security
 - Your bank will NEVER ask for personal information via text.
 - Do not click links from unknown senders.
- Verify the sender before taking any action and delete suspicious messages.
